Catholic Community Services of Northern Utah would like to express our deepest appreciation for your donation of \$5,000.00 dated 12/20/2016 in support of our Joyce Hansen Hall Food Bank, Bridging the Gap and St. Martha's Baby Layette Programs.

In 2016, we were able to provide 21,562 carts of food to families through our Joyce Hansen Hall Food Bank, and serve 23,782 hungry elementary students with weekend food through Bridging the Gap. Overall, we helped almost 89,000 individuals in our community with 2.6 million pounds of food, which is equivalent to 2,156,385 meals. All of our clients in the pantry are also offered case management and resource referrals, so the food we provide allows them to focus their time and resources on improving other areas of their lives.

CCS has been working in Northern Utah since 1982 to reduce poverty, alleviate hunger, promote human dignity and provide those most in need with the tools to achieve self-sufficiency. Our work would not be possible without individuals in our community who are committed to serving others. Thank you again for your generosity and your partnership in serving families in need throughout Northern Utah. Together, we can provide help and create hope.

2016 Statistics

Between our two food programs, we were able to help 88,850 hungry individuals in 9,695 unduplicated households with food in 2016. 57% of the family members were under the age of 18, 33% were between 18-64, and 10% were 65 and over.

Joyce Hansen Hall Food Bank

- 21,562 food baskets were provided
- 65,068 individuals were helped with food
- We assisted 85 homeless individuals, along with their 42 dependents, through our homeless pantry.
- We did 2,424 home deliveries to the elderly and disabled
- We handed out 492 bags of emergency food
- We distributed 2,587,662 pounds of food, plus 186,358 pounds of non-food (hygiene, cleaners, pet food, etc)
 - 38% came from community & corporate donations, 23% from grocery rescue, 20% from USDA and 19% from the Utah Food Bank
 - We passed on 163,844 pounds of food from the Utah Food Bank, and shared an additional 91,740 pounds of our own food with other agencies in Weber County
- We provided 2,644 homes with holiday meals for Thanksgiving and Christmas
- We helped 3,038 clients with diapers, and 758 clients with formula
- We handed out 55 birthday bags to help children under 12 celebrate their big day
- Case management appointments were increased by 32% from the first-half to the second-half of the year

Bridging the Gap (BTG)

- 23,782 elementary students were served through Bridging the Gap
- We grew the program from serving 2,000 kids in 5 schools to 3,000 kids in 6 schools (*in addition to adding a school, two schools doubled in size*)
